BE A PART OF CALIFORNIA'S REDISTRICTING PROCESS!

Redistricting is a once-in-a-decade opportunity to redraw the state's legislative districts. This single act may do more to influence the make-up of the legislature and its agenda over the next 10 years than all of the elections during that period combined. Every single policy issue is affected by who is elected to the legislature, and every single legislative election for the next decade is affected by redistricting. It's that simple.

For the first time, this critical task will not be performed by elected officials but by a new Citizens Redistricting Commission.

Applications are accepted until February 12, 2010. The top applicants will be asked to participate in

interviews in the summer and final selections will be announced in December 2010.

What is Redistricting and Why Should Our Community Care?

Redistricting is the once-in-a-decade opportunity to redraw the State's legislative districts. This single act may do more to influence the make-up of the Legislature and its agenda over the next 10 years than all of the elections during that period combined. Every single policy issue is affected by who is elected to the Legislature, and every single legislative election for the next decade is affected by redistricting. It's that simple.

For the first time, this critical task will not be performed by elected officials but by a new Citizens Redistricting Commission. Those communities that participate will have more power to shape the state than ever before; those that do not will allow others to decide who will represent them for the next decade.

What is the Citizens Redistricting Commission?

The newly formed 14-member Commission will consist of 5 Democrats, 5 Republicans, and 4 individuals who are Independents or members of a third party. The goal is to create a commission that is representative of California's diversity including racial, ethnic, geographic, economic, and gender characteristics. The Commission will be selected in 2010 and will do most of its work to redraw State Assembly, Senate, and Board of Equalizations districts in 2011.

How Can Members of Our Community Apply? Applications will be accepted by the State from December 15, 2009 to February 12, 2010.

Applicants must provide background information, answer four short essay questions about their qualifications and interest in serving, and gather three letters of recommendation. The top applicants will be asked to participate in interviews in the summer, and final selections will be announced in December 2010.

Applicants should know that serving on the Commission will not be a full-time job, but it will require a significant time commitment in 2011, especially between May and September. Members

will receive \$300 for each day they undertake redistricting business. No employer can terminate, punish, intimidate, coerce, retaliate against or threaten an employee for serving on the Commission or missing work for Commission business.

What Types of People from Our Community Can Serve?

A person must (1) have been registered continuously with the same political party for at least 5 years; and (2) have voted in 2 out of the last 3 state general elections.

Prior experience with redistricting, while beneficial, is not a requirement to be on the Commission.

Applicants who can demonstrate through their previous experience some or all of the following skills will have a much greater chance of being selected:

Strong analytical and fact-gathering skills;

An ability to read and understand technical information, such as statistics and maps; Familiarity with computers and software programs; Strong communication skills, an ability to work well in groups and participate in public hearings; An ability to understand legal standards; An understanding of California's diverse demographics and geography; and, An ability to be impartial.

Who from Our Community Can't Serve?

Staff or consultants (or immediate family members) to the Governor or any member of the Legislature, Congress, or State Board of Equalization, or anyone under contract with any of those governmental entities, cannot serve. In addition, an individual cannot serve who, in the last 10 years, has done any of the following:

Run for or been elected to federal or state office;
Been appointed to a board or commission by the Governor, a Legislator, or Member of Congress;
Served as an officer, employee, or consultant of a political party or candidate campaign for state or federal office; Served as a member of a political party central committee; Been a registered lobbyist;
Served as paid congressional, legislative, or Board of Equalization staff; or

Contributed \$2,000 or more to a candidate running for local, state, or congressional office.

Who from Our Community Should Be Encouraged to Apply?

It is important that individuals who apply for the Commission understand how important redistricting is to enhancing or diminishing the political power of individual communities. Potential commissioners need to understand that redistricting is not a simple process of drawing circles and squares. Redistricting is a nuanced process that requires time and attention to fairly balance the different interests of various communities.

Below are just some of the professions or experiences that might make one well qualified to serve:

Community and labor organizers; Social activists; Local elected officials; Locally-appointed board and commission members; College professors and administrators; Professionals such as lawyers, doctors, accountants, and financial analysts; Information technology analysts and other computer experts; Demographers, journalists, and researchers; and State and local government employees who routinely work with the public or analyze technical or legal materials.

Individuals whose primary activities have been at the statewide level are much more likely to have disqualifying conflicts. Therefore, communities that encourage local community leaders to apply are more likely to be successful.

It is important to remember that the Commission must reflect the State's diversity, including its racial, ethnic, and geographic diversity. Therefore, communities that encourage a diverse range of members to apply are also more likely to be successful.

**Important information regarding the 2010
Census**

With the U.S. Census process beginning, the Better Business Bureau (BBB) advises people to be cooperative, but cautious, so as not to become a victim of fraud or identity theft. The first phase of the 2010 U.S. Census is under way as workers have begun verifying the addresses of households across the country. Eventually, more than 140,000 U.S. Census workers will count every person in the United States and will gather information about every person living at each address including name, age, gender, race, and other relevant data. The big question is - how do you tell the difference between a U.S. Census worker and a con artist?

Better Business Bureau offers some advice:

**** If a U.S. Census worker knocks on your door,** they will have a badge, a handheld device, a Census Bureau canvas bag, and a confidentiality notice. Ask to see their identification and their badge before answering their questions. However, you should never invite anyone you don't know into your home.

**** Census workers are currently only knocking on doors to verify address information.** Do not give your Social Security number, credit card or banking information to anyone, even if they claim they need it for the U.S. Census. While the Census Bureau might ask for basic financial information, such as a salary range, it will not ask for Social Security, bank account, or credit card numbers nor will employees solicit donations.

Eventually, Census workers may contact you by telephone, mail, or in person at home. However, they will not contact you by Email, so be on the lookout for Email scams impersonating the Census. Never click on a link or open any attachments in an Email that are supposedly from the U.S. Census Bureau.

Why Are Republicans Better Storytellers?

Democrats make lousy narrators.

If you're a movement conservative — the only kind of Republican in the media, which means the only kind of Republican who exists — then everything that happens can be explained by the same simple story:

"Once upon a time, there was a free market. Businesses were left alone to create jobs and wealth; traditional values endured; America ruled the world. But when Democrats had their chance, they killed business with big government; they destroyed the American way of life with immorality and coddling; they blamed America and romanticized our enemies".

No truths are too inconvenient to fit that frame. The Reagan and George W. Bush deficits had nothing to do with big government, nor does Medicare; hanky-panky from Enron to AIG proves nothing, nor does 9/11 on Bush's watch,

nor the lack of WMDs in Iraq; discrimination went away by itself; and there was no cause for the trade union movement to exist; the Pentagon needs every weapon system it asks for, no matter how obsolete or bloated; we love our veterans, no matter how much they're shafted by the system when they come home from war.

But Democrats are tongue-tied. Whatever the issue — health care, energy, the economy, trade — it's complicated. Everything is always about everything else. Policies have seven sub-points. Issues have six sides. Progress is about compromise. Democracy is messy. Let me explain to you one more time why the banks are too big to fail.

Democrats may have the facts on their side, and things may well be too complex to explain with slogans, but that doesn't mean that locating events on a simple story line is beneath the dignity of educated people. Columnists like Frank Rich, Paul Krugman and Tom Friedman manage to fit the news of the world into a comprehensible, coherent, ongoing accounts of how we got to where we are.

Stop Overusing Antibiotics on Healthy Farm Animals: *Preservation of Antibiotics for Medical Treatment Act*

There is legislation before Congress that is making drug companies very nervous. And that's a good thing. This legislation would ban antibiotics in farm animal feed -- a practice that is both unnecessary and dangerous. Now here's the truly scary part: industrial-scale farms feed animals huge amounts of antibiotics. The vast majority of the time these drugs are used not to treat disease, but to promote growth and to compensate for stressful, crowded conditions.

The *Preservation of Antibiotics for Medical Treatment Act*, if passed, will make the Food and Drug Administration reevaluate the agricultural uses of seven classes of antibiotics that are important to human health. Please support this important act, for the health of our farms and ourselves!

The use of so many antibiotics in animal agriculture also speeds the development and spread of resistant bacteria, which makes many life-saving medicines less effective.

Resistance to antibiotics is a public health crisis on the rise. These crucial drugs should only be used when necessary but 70 percent of antibiotics used in the United States are given to healthy chickens, pigs and cattle to increase weight gain or to prevent illnesses.

This overuse of antibiotics puts humans in danger because it spreads bacteria that develop resistances to life-saving drugs. That's why we need to pass the Preservation of Antibiotics for Medical Treatment Act, which will make the Food and Drug Administration reevaluate agricultural uses of the seven classes of antibiotics that are important to human health.

Whitman loans campaign another \$20 million

(CNN) – The two Republican candidates for governor in California have coffers full of cash to battle for their party's nomination, and much of it has come from their own pockets.

Meg Whitman has contributed almost \$40 million to her campaign so far. The former CEO

of eBay announced Thursday that she has supplied her campaign with \$20 million in new funding. In 2009, Whitman gave her campaign \$19 million and raised \$10.2 million from donors. She now has more than \$30 million cash on hand to try to secure her party's nomination.

Whitman's infusion of money into her campaign's bank account bolsters her cash lead over her Republican rival, California's Insurance Commissioner Steve Poizner.

Poizner has \$17.5 million cash on hand, most of which came from his own contributions – he has given his campaign more than \$19 million since announcing his candidacy. The insurance commissioner has raised almost \$2.5 million from outside contributions.
